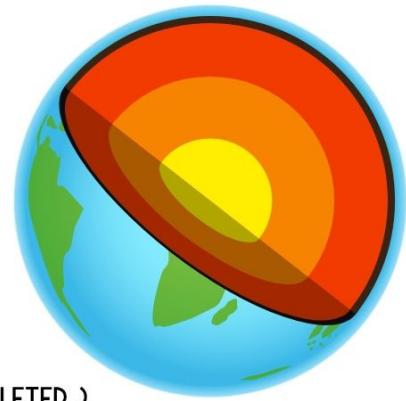
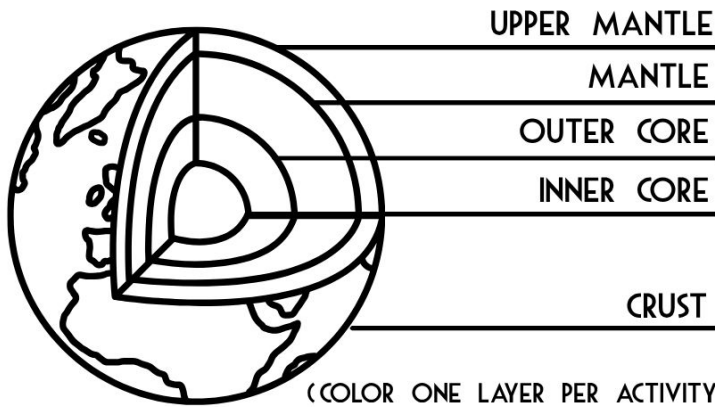

**Adult Reading/Activity Log. Choose two reading activities and one alternative activity to complete your first log.**

Reading Activities	Alternative Activities
Write a short review of a recent book you've read. Include the title and author with your review.	Check out a State Parks Pass and write a short Yelp-like review of the park you visit. (e.g. ★★★★★ Fun place to visit. Park rangers and signage were above par. The fossils reminded me that I am getting old and made me sad. 4.5 stars)
Summarize the book you read as a news headline. Include the title and author underneath your headline	Use the Mango language program from the library website. Complete at least one lesson and write a sentence that uses a new word or phrase that you learned.
Use your library card and the Libby App to read a magazine or newspaper. Summarize what you read and rate the experience with one to five stars.	Search for the "Purchase Request" function on the library website and request a book that you'd like to see in our collection. Write the title, author, and date of request on your log.
Listen to an audiobook. List the title and author on your log. Rate it with one to five stars and explain your rating. Read a children's book from your childhood. List the title and author on your log and answer this question: Why did you choose this book and what about your childhood does this story invoke? Rate your experience with one to five stars and an explanation (QR code below)
Read a book to or with someone else (child, grandparent, etc.) List the title and author on your log. Write a few sentences about the experience.	Write a short story or poem. Share it at an Open Mic at a library branch or make a copy for display at the library.
Read a book by a local author. List the title and author on your reading log and answer this question: What drew you to this title and author?	Do early literacy activities with a child such as writing letters in the sand, or with chalk on the sidewalk. On your log, list the activities you did. Read a graphic novel or comic book. On your log, list the title and author and answer this question: What do you like or dislike about reading a graphic book vs. a traditional book?
