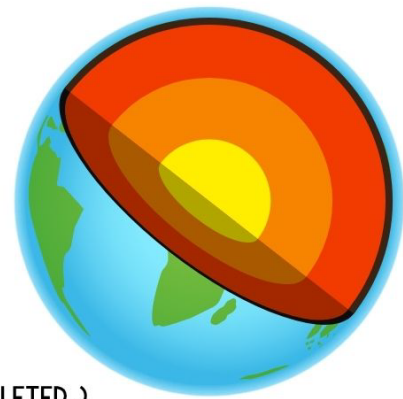
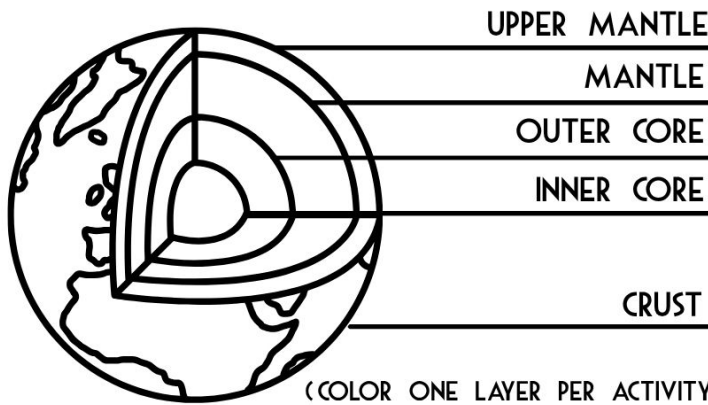

Teen Reading/Activity Log. Choose three reading activities and two alternative activities to complete your first log.

Reading Activities	Alternative Activities
Write a short review of a recent book you've read. Include the title and author with your review.	Use the Freegal Music App with your library card and create a song playlist that complements your favorite parts of a book
Read a book. On your log, summarize the book you read as a news headline. Include the title and author underneath your headline.	Use Mango Languages from the library website. Complete at least one lesson and write a sentence that uses a new word or phrase that you learned.
Read a "how to" book (arts & crafts/recipes/repair etc) Make or fix something by following the instructions in the book. On your log, list the title and author and describe what you made. Bring your finished product or pictures if you'd like to display it.	Attend a library program or event. List the name of the event on your log and what you enjoyed/didn't enjoy about the event.
Read a book and watch a movie based on a book. On your log, list the title and answer the following question: Which did you prefer and why?	Play a video game. On your log note the title of the game. Write a one-to-five-star review of the game with an explanation.
Read a children's book from your childhood. List the title and author on your log and answer this question: Why did you choose this book and what about your childhood does this story invoke?	Try a word game @ https://www.merriam-webster.com/games . On your log, list the game you played. Rate your experience with one to five stars and an explanation (QR code below)
Read a book. Write a letter to one of its characters. On your log, list the title and character's name and attach your letter for display in the library.	Write a short story or poem. Share it at an Open Mic at either the Paonia or Delta Library or make a copy for display at the library.
Read for an hour. On your log, list the title and author of what you read. Summarize your reading with a headline that captures the essence of the material.	Create an illustration for your favorite book. On your log, list the title and author of the book. Bring a copy of your illustration for display at the library.
Read a graphic novel or comic book. On your log, list the title and author and answer this question: What do you like or dislike about reading a graphic book vs. a traditional book?	Add a book to the display of patron picks or recommended teen/YA books with a note about why you recommend it. On your log, note the title and author.
